12. Breaking the Silence: Preventing the Sexual Abuse of Minors

Breaking the Silence is a new program, created by a veteran documentary filmmaker, especially for students attending Diocese of Orange high schools and those youths who participate in the Diocese's youth ministry programs.

It is a powerful and excellent tool that utilizes an interactive DVD format to encourage teens to talk about sexual abuse and also to describe the danger signs of a potential abuser and offers young people an understanding of the realities of sexual abuse in our society. Teens typically are not comfortable talking about sexual abuse and it is their silence that makes it easier for offenders to continue stalking their targets and for victims to suffer alone. Programmed breaks between the individual segments permit students to discuss a question immediately after seeing it on the screen.

This program is recommended by the Diocese of Jackson, Mississippi with their youth in grades 9-12 in their churches and schools.

Children who are sexually abused are confused, scared, and hurt. To make matters worse, once they find the courage to reveal the abuse, they're often unable to get adults to believe them - especially if their abuser is a relative or close friend of the family.

This program helps youngsters understand that it's wrong to be touched in ways that make them uncomfortable. They learn how important it is to tell others about their confusion, fear, and hurt. Todd, a 3rd grader, learns from his puppet friends that he does not have to play "special games" and keep them secret. He also learns that sometimes you have to tell, and tell, and keep telling until someone believes you.

15. Break the Silence: Kids Against Child Abuse

Jane Seymour hosts this program that breaks open the terrible reality of child abuse. Physical abuse, sexual abuse, and neglect are explained in a way young children can understand. Four kids talk candidly about their abuse and their abusers as they describe how adults use fear, manipulation, and neglect to hurt children. As each story is told, animated versions of the child and the abuser help illustrate how the abuse happened and how it made the child feel. Each story ends happily. With the help of social workers, therapists, and foster families, these kids are receiving help and leading normal lives. The main point throughout the program is that children should tell an adult if they feel they are being abused, or if they know someone who is. Additionally, it is vital for adults to listen to children. Only when the silence is broken can the cycle of abuse end.
